## Jesus Christ is recognised as God:

**By himself** when he said *"I and the Father are one."* (John 10:30)

**By God** who declared Jesus as his son when Jesus was baptised. (Matt 3:16)

**By many others** who were with him, such as Peter who said

*"You are the Christ. The Son of the living God."* (Matt 16:16)

and Thomas who said *"My Lord and my God!"* (John 20:28)

**By evil spirits** who shouted out *"You are the Son of God."* (Mark 3:11)

## Jesus Christ taught as God.

such as when he predicted his death and resurrection (Luke 9:22).

His wisdom is recognised worldwide to this day.
